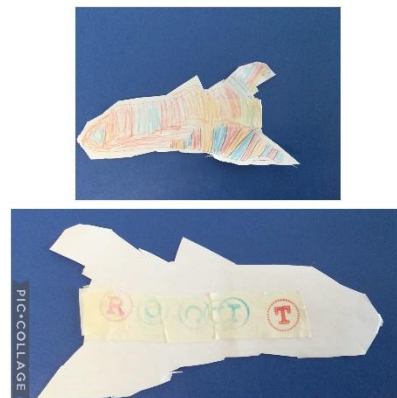


Acorn Update: Friday 28th June 2024
